

FACULTY-STUDENT COLLABORATION AWARDS

We are pleased to invite applications for a pair of funding awards from the Deputy Provost & Dean of Faculty (DOF):

1. **Faculty-Student Creation & Discovery Awards:** for teamwork that contributes to original research or an original creative or professional output.
2. **Faculty-Student Public Impact Awards:** for teamwork that brings existing knowledge/insights from one or more disciplines to bear on current or future issues of significant public importance, for example through written and/or audio-visual products for a non-academic audience or entrepreneurship projects.

These awards are designated for inclusive teams composed of up to 3 full-time faculty plus up to 3 undergraduate and/or master's students.

The application (maximum 3 pages) should:

- A. Choose one of the 2 categories above (Creation & Discovery or Public Impact)
- B. Exclude names of team members from main body of the application; include names in the email message to which application is attached
- C. Outline the work to be completed by the team in the Spring semester and its scholarly or public/changemaking importance
- D. Describe a mentorship plan for the student(s) involved, including how their research expertise will be enhanced by this collaboration
- E. Explain how the team reflects values of diversity and inclusion (without using names).

Applications may be submitted by email attachment to AssociateDOF@american.edu. Deadline is November 14, 2022. The work described in the proposal should be completed in the Spring semester 2023. Please include names of team members in your email message only.

Each team award provides a flat amount of \$1,500 per student (up to 3) and \$1,000 per faculty member (up to 3). Maximum award size is \$7,500. In this final year of these grants, total funding for all awards is \$15,000.

Awardee teams will be selected by a panel of judges based on

- Potential for scholarly or public/changemaking impact (item C above),
- Potential for deep student learning (item D above), and
- Breadth of faculty and student participation (item E above), which includes not only faculty and student demographic diversity, but also faculty mix: senior and junior faculty, term and tenure-line faculty, and/or inclusion of library faculty.

All awardee teams will describe the results of their collaborative work, including any plans to seek external funding, to the Deputy Provost & Dean of Faculty in a brief written report in Fall 2023.
